Sails, Stumps and Sand Irons – A History of Sport in Largo

Just as the three Largo villages differ in character, their sporting heritage also varies. Given its position on the sea, Lower Largo folks were destined to take to the water. From Victorian sea-bathers to modern-day dippers, and from the boat builders of yesteryear to the present-day Largo Bay Sailing Club, the allure of the water endures. In contrast, Upper Largo has a well-known cricketing heritage dating back 75 years. The elevated position of the ground offers panoramic views across Largo Bay and the ideal setting for this summer game. Lundin Links literally has golf reflected in its name. Lundin Golf Club boasts one of the finest links courses in Scotland while Lundin Ladies' Golf Club is one of the oldest ladies-only golf clubs in the world.

If those sporting credentials are not impressive enough then consider that back around 1910, Largo Parish had no less than three curling ponds. Harsher winters of the past meant that the 'roaring game' could offer a popular seasonal alternative to golf. Football was also once a feature of local sporting life. From the 1890s, Largo had a football team called 'Largo Crusoe' - an amateur team which featured in the East of Fife Juvenile Association. The team went into abeyance for the Great War years before evolving into 'Largo Rovers' in the 1920s, 'Largo Thistle' in the late 1930s and 'Largo Villa' post World War Two.

Stretching further back in time, Largo Parish had a true sporting hero in the form of 'Jumpin' Jimmy Methven'. Lundin Mill man James Methven toured local games meetings in the mid-19th century. He triumphed at various jumping events, at hammer throwing, vaulting with the pole and hurdle racing, winning medals and purses of cash for his prowess. Such contests which evolved into modern-day athletics events. Lundin Links briefly had its own annual games, where events included the mile race, half-mile race, running high leap, running spring leap and the hop, step and leap!

Soaring numbers of summer visitors to the area in the early 1900s led to the creation of the bowling green and tennis courts in Lundin Links, while Upper Largo also established its own equivalent facilities. These have largely managed to move with the times, notably with Lundin Sports Club becoming a centre for multiple racquet sports. To top off Largo's track record in sport, mention must be given to classic once-a-year events like the Law Race, taking runners up Largo Law, and the Fife Point-to-Point horse racing at Balcormo. There's certainly more sporting heritage associated with this place than just the gowfff!

Summer Recipe

Wild sea trout with sorrel sauce

As readers of this column will know, I am fond of harvesting produce from the wild and as I write I am making best use of wild garlic. However, as you read this, wild sorrel will be readily available and I love adding it to salads, but this recipe is particularly suitable with wild sea trout which has its short season about now. Always ask your fishmonger if it is wild as otherwise it might well be farmed. This is a classic French dish I first learned



at the Savoy hotel in London, I had never cooked with sorrel before or Oseille as the French call it. As a child in Aberdeenshire we picked it wild and called it “sourrocks” as it was so sharp. It’s a perfect foil for the rich flavour of salmon. This photo shows it with a grilled salmon steak, but it is also perfect cut into thin slices or escalopes taken from the tail piece of a wild sea trout, ask your fishmonger to slice it for you.

INGREDIENTS

Allow three thin slices per person taken from the tail piece of a wild sea trout:

- 600g in all
- 3 tsp butter
- Salt and pepper
- 150g sorrel leaves, finely chopped
- 150 ml dry vermouth
- 100 mls double cream

METHOD

1 Put the butter in a frying pan, and when it melts, season the sea trout escalopes and place in the pan, cook gently for 2 minutes and then turn over and cook until the fish is cooked, it will turn whitish pink. Set aside on a plate to keep warm.

2 Stir the sorrel into the pan and cook gently for a few minutes. Add the vermouth and allow to bubble up then add the cream and reduce to a light coating texture, season and serve.

I prefer to put the sauce on to four warm plates and then place the fish on top.

The Drummochy Dinghy

Following the recent article about Nicola MacFarlane Young and the dinghy on Cellar Braes, (now known as “The Drummochy Dinghy”), some of the residents of Drummochy Road got together to raise a new mast to replace the previous rusty pole. Ewen McCaskel found the mast, Alan Melvin upgraded it and rigged it, Alan Cochrane used his engineering skills to secure it in place, and the Drummochy Sewing Circle (Shona, Alison and Jan) provided the flags. Around thirty people and several dogs, gathered to witness a ceremony dating back to Ancient Greece, called “mast stepping,” where a coin is placed under the mast. Tradition has it that in the event of the crew drowning, the coin was used to pay Charon the ferryman to transport them across the river Styx to the Afterlife. Before the ceremony, Alan explained that the village’s two nautical heroes, Sir Andrew Wood and Alex Selcraig (who changed his name to Alexander Selkirk) probably learned their

sea-faring skills in a craft of similar size to our battle-scarred dinghy. He then invited Nicola to insert a time capsule under the mast. The capsule contained a new 50 pence coin with the head of King Charles, (courtesy of Ian Hay), plus the LargoLinks article about Nicola, and an account of the ceremony. Nicola then raised the mast in memory of her late father who worked in a shipyard from the age of fifteen. The enthusiastic crowd were then rewarded with chocolate treats from Zaphar. The improvement has created a welcome new Lower Largo Landmark which celebrates the carved message in front of the boat: **“Variety is the Spice of Fife”**.



LCT's Assets and Access Group



One of the great strengths of our Largo Communities Together (LCT) development trust is that it provides an 'umbrella' of services supporting a range of projects, all with a common goal; to enhance community life for the people of the Largo area. To name but a few, LCT provides governance, insurance, finance, communication and coordination across a number of different projects. While initially LCT was incorporated to support the Largo House initiative, projects now include The Place Plan, Largo Pier, Resilience and Friends of Largo Bay, plus many more. One of the latest to join this is the Assets and Access initiative. As the name suggests we have a dual remit.

Our *Assets* activities provide a focal point of expertise and resources within LCT for all things around understanding the ownership, and potential acquisition,

of land and buildings that are of benefit to the community.

Our related *Access* activities are focussed on supporting, maintaining and enhancing the footpath networks within and between our communities; for the benefit of walkers, cyclists and accessibility. I think we often take for granted the rich network of paths we have in our area; some publicly owned, some across private land, some

maintained by external organisations, some neglected, some almost forgotten and barely passable. Our goal is to first document, share and promote what we have, then to consult and prioritise areas where the network can be enhanced to provide better greener links between communities.



For example improving the link between Upper and Lower Largo and between the villages of Woodside and New Gilston.

Lundin Sports Club Table Tennis

Friends of Largo Bay

As a local voluntary group, passionate about protecting and enhancing Largo Bay, Friends of Largo Bay started out organising beach cleans. Responsive to suggestions made by members of our community we soon moved onto



investigating the marine life of the Bay. This article focuses on those biodiversity monitoring activities that take us outdoors, onto the beach wearing wet weather gear and

hi vis vests and have us scuttle over the rocks with cameras and clipboards. It is testimony to the dedication of these volunteers that these activities have continued through rain, hail and sunshine; through named storms and some very, very high tides.

The Species Library records Largo Bay seashore and intertidal life from anemones to bladderwrack; from barnacles to crabs; from prawns to mussels. Over 200 entries are documented in our Library; in liaison with Fife Records Library we ensure the data gathered is of suitable quality and format to be added to their databases. *The monitoring of the Intertidal Rocky Shore*. This is a much more structured and scientific exercise with more emphasis on zonation on the beach and quantifying data. We use equipment such as quadrats

and transects to give very accurate survey results. These are snapshots of what can be found at a specific point in time; crucial in terms of measuring the health of this environment now and moving forward. Seagrass planting and oyster restoration projects run by Restoration Forth are two further activities supported by Friends of Largo Bay. Last year we discovered our own seagrass colonies living in Largo Bay. Seagrass used to be prevalent in the Firth of Forth but over time there has been significant decline so our finds have been met with great excitement. Our very precious colonies will continue to be monitored.

Lastly we have just conducted a *Big Seaweed Search*; aiding the Marine Conservation Society and Natural History Museum to study Climate Change through changing distribution of seaweeds and introduction of invasive species. Aside from being involved in some very worthwhile and sometimes energetic activities, we also very much enjoy the social aspect. We meet at The Railway in Lower Largo of an evening to share our interests, some cracking stories and a drink or two. We offer a very warm welcome to all who would like to come along and assist in whatever capacity. 

