

Old Largo – The Belmont Temperance Hotel

As the start of 2026 nears, we also approach the 100-year anniversary of the sad demise of the Belmont Temperance Hotel. This alcohol-free hotel one stood proudly on an elevated site adjacent to Largo Railway Station, offering extensive views across the bay.



The need for a new hotel to meet the enormous demand for visitor accommodation was first raised in 1890.

Within a couple of years, the elevenbedroom Belmont Hotel was welcoming its first guests - many of whom were attracted by its lack of a license to serve alcohol. Owned by local joiner Andrew Masterston, the Belmont had a number of different tenant hotelkeepers over the years, some of whom attempted to gain an alcohol license to no avail. The licensing board were keen to keep at least one place for "temperance people". Indeed, the hotel was a favourite destination for tea parties and picnics for day tripping temperance groups as well as for overnight guests. In December 1921 the wedding reception of the only daughter of the minister of Largo Baptist Church, Rev. Pulford, took place at the hotel.

The story of the Belmont Temperance
Hotel came to an abrupt end in the early
hours of Friday 22 January 1926, when
the hotel was gutted by fire. Only the
hotelier Hugh McLean, his wife Janet and
their child were occupying the hotel at the
time. Local newspapers reported that:

"In the early hours of the morning Mr McLean was awakened by the insistent barking of his dog and, assuming that something must be wrong, he made investigation and found the lower part of the building a mass of flames. The occupants promptly made their escape in night attire and were received at a friend's house."

The Fire Brigade were called but by the time they arrived it was clear that the hotel was beyond saving and the focus was on protecting the surrounding buildings and railway. A shortage of water hampered their work and use had to be made of the sea, although this proved to be challenging as the tide was far out and the hotel situated in an elevated position. Seven hours later the fire brigade left but the hotel's interior was completely destroyed, the roof had fallen in and only the walls remained. This magnitude of the blaze had drawn many spectators and must have lived long in the memories of those that witnessed this disastrous fire a century ago.



Courgette Frittata Recipe



A simple take on the Spanish tapa, this can be served either hot or cold and is a great picnic standby.

Ingredients

4 new potatoes, cooked

3 courgettes, diced

2 tblsp olive oil

2 spring onions

3 tblsp chopped parsley

6 eggs

75g Anster cheese, grated

Salt and freshly ground black pepper


Method

- 1. Turn the grill to high.
- 2. Dice the potatoes and cook in a medium frying pan, to colour a little.
- 3. Add the courgettes and stir to mix with the potatoes, add the spring onions and cook for a few minutes.
- 4. Throw in the parsley and mix thoroughly.
- 5. Beat the eggs together and season with salt and pepper, and pour over the mixture, shaking and stirring lightly to mix well in, reduce the heat and cook until the mixture comes away from the pan base.
- 6. Sprinkle over the grated cheese and brown under a hot grill.

Largo Harbour Area Regeneration Update



Last October, at the community meeting at the Durham Hall, the Pier Group announced that their work to renovate the damaged pier had stopped. This was due to several factors: lack of funding, timescales relating to agreed funding, legal issues on ownership and indemnity issues with LCT. However, it was promised that efforts would continue to investigate other ways to get the pier restored.

A workshop was held at the Crusoe Hotel in September to look at stabilisation and maintenance of the pier to avoid further damage, potential for damage to adjacent infrastructure and homes (if more of the pier is lost), innovative ways of restoring the pier (linking it to wider issues like marine erosion, sustainability, tourism etc) and alternative sources of funding.

The workshop was attended by 16 invited people including: our local MP Wendy Chamberlain, our MSP Jenny Gilruth, local Councillors, Graham Bucknall (Crusoe Hotel), Sailing Club, Boat Club, LCT and a

number of locals who had expressed interest in the pier.

The meeting was very positive but acknowledged that the biggest issue in restoring the pier will be funding. Funding from public bodies generally requires that the project can demonstrate a commercial benefit to the community. So far, we have not been able to do this with any great success. Maybe someone knows of a wealthy benefactor!!

The current owners of the Crusoe Hotel lease the building and the pier to Graham and Rachel Bucknall. It is their intention to fully purchase the hotel in the future. They are very aware of the maintenance issues around the pier and the harbour walls at their car park and want to work with the pier group and the Boat Club to look at the ongoing maintenance.

A new Harbour Area Regeneration Group has been formed. This will include representatives from; Crusoe Hotel, LCT, Boat Club, Sailing Club, Friends of Largo Bay, and a number of locals passionate about the pier. Their remit will be confirmed at the first meeting (to be held in the next month or so), but it is likely to be threefold.

Firstly, to make sure that the pier is suitably maintained and stabilised. Secondly, to look at the potential damage that could be caused to the road bridge, local businesses and homes if the pier is damaged further.

Thirdly, to look at innovative wavs to fund and restore the pier.

The original remit from the Community was to try to restore the pier to its original length and

condition while making sure that its construction was fit to withstand future storms.

The Group will be approaching any restoration of the pier with a more open mind so that funding may be more forthcoming and that the benefits to the local and wider community are investigated.

So far approximately £80,000 has been spent on the potential pier restoration. Nearly half of this was donated by the community.

Most of this money has been spent on obtaining a design proposal for the pier restoration with some monies being used to undertake some maintenance of the pier. The restoration of our pier is a project dear to the heart of our villages, and we wish to see something positive happening to this crumbling edifice.

We will keep everyone updated on how this new group progresses.

Friends of Largo Bay Blue Communities Research Project



The term green space is widely used to encompass the natural

environment. Think of green space and you typically have an image of woodland, fields, park. All land that is non-urban. But here in Largo a new emerging term blue space provides a useful shorthand for everything related to the sea. And for Largo it defines our community.

The blue space is why many of us choose to live here or come to visit. FoLB's reason for being is to protect, enhance and value this blue space with initiatives such as litter picks, environmental monitoring, art and education.

Increasingly it is about tackling the source of the problems that negatively impact our blue space. For example, rather than "just" picking litter we also do a sample survey of what items are collected. This information is sent to Marine Scotland and helps evidence national initiatives such as reducing single-use plastics or tackling fishing industry waste. Evidence is key, which is why we are delighted to have been selected to participate in a year-long research project entitled "Blue Communities of The Forth Riven Basin".

Led by Stirling University we will be providing our community's perspective on

the value of blue space. Working with two other coastal communities and two heritage organisations, the goals of this research project are

- 1. Examine the development of coastal communities in the Forth River Basin over previous centuries and the changing value of the Forth
- 2. Empower communities through coproduction of knowledge on how environmental and policy-related drivers influence coastal blue space quality now and into the future
- 3. Develop a participatory tool and framework to tackle trade-offs and conflicts in blue space usage across coastal communities of the Forth River Basin

The overall aim of the project is to characterise and evaluate opportunities and risks to coastal blue space associated with our changing climate and management decisions in the Forth River Basin.



As a representative community starting December, we will be participating in workshops looking at our local environment, culture and heritage. We see this as a powerful way to evidence the issues we face to enhance and protect our most valued blue space. Largo Parish Church - News



The times they are a changin' sang Bob Dylan, and however else that is true, the times are certainly changing for Largo Parish Church.

As part of Fife Presbytery's mission plan, on the 1st of January 2026, Largo will be united with the neighbouring parishes of East Neuk Trinity and St Monans to become Fife Coastal Trinity Parish Church. All being well, the process of calling a new minister (who will live in what was the Largo Manse in Castaway Lane), will get started and I am hoping an appointment will be made in the spring of 2026.

As you can imagine a great deal of work is happening in the background bringing together the life of three congregations. Various working groups have been formed to deal with the finance, fabric and different aspects of church life.

A shadow Kirk Session has been established to take over responsibility for the new congregation and parish in the new year.

With regard to Sunday services, they will continue to be held in each of the constituent parts of the new parish at 10:30 am. So the pattern of Sunday services at Largo will continue as normal with the exception of a monthly united service in one part of the parish. Please check the church website for details.

A Minister will always be available to offer pastoral support or to help with a baptism, wedding, or funeral service. Meanwhile preparations are well underway for the Advent and Christmas season, and you will be very welcome to attend all of the festive season services.

Holiday Memories Feb 1951, Part 2

Continuing on from Issue 20, this is part 2 of Nora Beveridge's amazing recollections of holidays in Largo. This story was gathered as part of LCT's Heritage Project.

We first came on holiday to Largo in 1951...

Vans travelled daily round the village or sent boys on bikes for orders; Ireland the baker and Fisher and Donaldson, and The Central Stores for fruit and vegetables and Brunton the butcher. Supplies had to be brought daily as there were no fridges and houses had a meat safe on an outside wall to keep things cool.

After four years it became more common to buy a holiday house and we bought 16, Drum Park in 1955. We came for two months every summer and at Easter, and for long weekends throughout the year until we moved permanently to Largo in 1988.

Leisure time was spent in The Crusoe Hotel, run by Sam and Sheila Nicoll, and the La Scala Cinema, now replaced by a block of flats, which showed good films followed by dances on a Friday and Saturday night. Janeck Jurecki had a cafe with a jukebox which was a great draw for the young, where milkshakes and ice drinks were popular. He then opened the Viennese tearoom.

There were many other shops in Lundin Links Including Mr Cairns, with the bushy grey hair, the ironmonger, clothes shops one for children next to the ironmongers and another on the corner of Hillhead St and opposite was Jeannie Turbayne's, the grocer.

Largo was a tourist Mecca! People came for day trips on the train, over the viaduct, and went for boat trips round the Bay on the Bluebell and the Falcon, or hired rowing boats from Mr Melville? I believe there were Pierrots on the pier but that was before our time.

Evening entertainment for the young centred round Granny Forte's chip shop where the smoke spiralled into the village depending on which way the wind was blowing.



At Drum Park we had a field next door for 25 years where many games of French cricket or rounders were lost and won, or when the tide was out, on the beach, in the 'Big Bay' beside the Lundies. There was also a swing park and sand dunes at the end of Drum Park, past the joiner's workshop which had bats at night!

Holiday Memories continued...

We had swimming parties when almost all the summer residents of Drum park would be in the water together.

Neighbours had a rowing dinghy, and the children would have fishing trips for flounders and mackerel, which they then gave out all along the terrace.

In July, most years, the children put on a show which always took place in our garden as we had a side entrance. We charged 1p for entrance which was donated to the Women's Guild!

The same families came every year, from Glasgow, Edinburgh, Liverpool, Dunfermline and Kirkcaldy and even from France! Every August there were football matches between the locals and the visitors run by Mr and Mrs Grassick, and the kids looked forward every year to the summer traditions of climbing Largo Law, the chain walk at Elie, The Shell House and the shows at Leven, and a bonfire at Johnson's Mill.

Now the children and grandchildren of these families still come and still enjoy holidays in the village. Although many things have changed, there are still the same lovely views, the same sandy beaches and rock pools and the same special family holiday experience.

A party of French school children from our twin town, Villennes-sur-Seine, enjoyed a memorable visit to the Largo area, organised by the Largo Area Community Council.





Largo Cricket Club - Community Consultation Results

Survey reveals strong local support and priorities for improvement

This summer Largo Cricket Club (LCC) invited local residents to share their views on the club's role in the community and its future plans. The consultation attracted 111 responses, mainly from Upper Largo (34%), Lundin Links (22%) and Lower Largo (12%), with others from surrounding areas.

Community engagement

The East Drive ground is more than a cricket pitch. Nearly 40% of respondents attend matches as spectators, while 22% use the space for dog walking and exercise. Around 20% have children involved in Largo Lions junior cricket, and 17% play regularly. One resident summed it up: "Just so good to see youngsters being encouraged."

Perceived community benefit

Two-thirds of respondents believe the club benefits the community "to a great extent", citing its role in promoting sport and social interaction. As one comment put it: "Having this facility for both sport and the local community is invaluable."

Desired improvements

Top priorities include better facilities such as accessible toilets and seating (68%), hiring the pavilion for community events (52%) and cricket taster sessions in schools (46%). Other suggestions included improved access for those with limited

mobility and continued support for dog walking. A parent noted: "Accessible toilets would make a big difference for families."

Support for buying the ground

An overwhelming 90% back the idea of LCC buying the ground through a Community Asset Transfer to secure its future. However, a few raised concerns about maintaining public access: "I worry about losing public rights if the club owns the ground." Responding to this concern, Club President, Ally Duncan, said: "Largo Cricket Club has always welcomed local residents – including dogs! – to enjoy the ground at East Drive. This approach will continue regardless of whether the club successfully buys the land or not."

Conclusions and next steps

The consultation confirms strong local support for LCC and its ambitions. The club plans to prioritise facility upgrades, inclusive cricket opportunities and explore wider community use of the pavilion. Regular communication and affordable membership will remain key. The club will continue with the next steps on securing the ground through asset transfer and will keep all club members and Largo residents updated on our progress.


