Editorial

This year marks 350 years since the birth of Alexander Selkirk, the sailor from Lower Largo whose real-life adventure helped inspire Robinson Crusoe. Selkirk grew up here before leaving home as a young man to go to sea. In 1704, after arguing with his captain and worrying that the ship was unsafe, he chose to stay behind on an empty island. He soon regretted it, but he survived alone for more than four years by hunting, fishing and using whatever he could find. His rescue and return later made him famous across the globe. Selkirk's story is a strong part of our local history. It shows how someone from a small place like ours can face great challenges and still come through. Look out for events throughout the year to help celebrate his life and legacy.

Commemorating Alexander Selkirk Over the Centuries

The life of Alexander Selkirk (1676–1721) has been commemorated in many ways over the centuries since his story of survival on an uninhabited Pacific island for more than four years became widely known. Selkirk's native Largo has led the way in celebrating their famous son.

Alexander left behind a range of personal possessions when he left Largo for the last time, including items that had been with him on the island such as his sea-chest, coconut cup, powder horn, knife and musket. For many decades after his death, descendants of his eldest brother David safeguarded those items.

When Catherine Gillies (nee Selkirk) died in 1862, the local press reported that she had "guarded most religiously the cup and chest, which, as interesting relics, had descended as an heirloom in the family" since the death of her father. Her cottage became a place of pilgrimage for those with an interest in the Alexander Selkirk life story. Sir Walter Scott was so moved by the objects when he visited Largo that he arranged for the coconut cup's rim to be banded with silver, and for the addition of the rosewood stem and foot.

In 1868, thousands of miles away, crew of the British warship HMS Topaze installed a bronze tablet at "Selkirk's Lookout" on Juan Fernández Island (now Robinson Crusoe Island) to commemorate Alexander Selkirk.

Back in Largo around the same time innkeeper James Gilchrist introduced the 'Crusoe Hotel' name to the inn at the granary at Largo Harbour. Soon afterwards, plans began to form in the village to create a permanent public memorial. The life-sized bronze statue sculpted by Thomas Stuart Burnett was unveiled on 11 December 1885, depicting the man himself in goatskin clothing, holding a musket and gazing out toward the sea. The day of the unveiling was truly a red-letter day for the community, marked by ceremony, procession, banners, guests of honour and a festival atmosphere.

In 1966, the Chilean government renamed the island where Selkirk was marooned (formerly Más a Tierra) 'Robinson Crusoe Island' and the neighbouring island (formerly Más Afuera) to 'Alejandro Selkirk Island'. A decade later in 1976 Largo marked 300 years since the birth of Selkirk in style.


In what the local press called a "frenzied ten days of Crusoe carousing" a huge range of events took place across the three villages, making it a summer to remember. Now another half century has passed by and the 350th anniversary of Alexander Selkirk's birth is upon us! Look out for news of events to mark the latest in a long line of commemorations of Alexander Selkirk – the real Robinson Crusoe.

Largo Communities Together: Building on Solid Foundations

(LCT) has had a busy year, with projects across our subgroups continuing to develop.

The Blue Space Festival will bring coastal celebration and environmental awareness together. We're proud to support the Changing Places toilet facility, and we've run a pilot youth film project. Planning is well underway for the Alexander Selkirk 350th Anniversary celebrations. The Warm Welcome programme ran through winter, offering regular gathering spaces, and we'll be starting up again towards the end of 2026.

The Resilience Group has been working on emergency planning and is keen for more people to get involved. Greenways is making progress on pathways and active travel routes and are mapping and uncovering routes. Friends of Largo Bay continues protecting our coastal environment, and the Heritage group has been bringing local history to life. You'll find more detail about all of this throughout these pages.

Our Big Picnic on 21 June is a chance to come together and celebrate what we've achieved. We hope you'll join us. Events like this help us get to know each other better, and those connections are what make community projects work - not to mention being a lot of fun! Get in touch to help out with that - it will be fantastic.

We held a successful AGM at the end of last year. If you're not yet a member but would like to help shape what LCT does, you can join for free via our website. Everything LCT achieves comes from volunteers: trustees, subgroup members, and local people giving their time and skills. What's been delivered, from festivals to emergency planning to community consultations, shows how much people care about this area. That includes you!

We are grateful to be part of the Development Trust Association Scotland, which enables us to learn from communities across the country. We collaborate with partners such as the Coastal Communities Network, the Largo Area Community Council, the Fife Coast and Countryside Trust, Fife Council, Fife Voluntary Action, and our funders. While these partnerships are beneficial, it is the local people and their energy that truly drive progress.

LCT new 'Greenways' subgroup

The previous 'Assets and Access' subgroup has morphed into separate subgroups with the 'Access' remit now being taken over by a reconstituted 'Greenways' subgroup.

The aim of this subgroup is to: **“improve the path network of the Largo area for walkers, cyclists and wheelers and to encourage active travel”**.

The goals of the 'Greenways' subgroup include:

- an audit of the existing path network with regard to extent, ownership and condition
- the mapping and publicising of the path network in order to increase usage by community and visitors
- the possibility of adding to the existing path network

The above goals directly stem from points raised in the extensive community consultation that took place over a period of time and concluded with the publication in Dec 2023 of the Local Place Plan and Community Action Plan.

These goals link also to Fife Council Active Travel Strategy (2025-2035) published in Sept 2025.

'Greenways' is a term increasingly in use and has been defined as “communication routes reserved exclusively for non-motorised journeys...which enhance both the environment and quality of life”.

Selkirk 350

The Largo Heritage Group are planning to commemorate 350 years since the birth of Alexander Selkirk this year, and we are hoping the community will use this opportunity to come together to recognise the importance of the life experiences of one of Largo's sons.

The Group are planning an exhibition from the 22nd to the 30th of August with information about the life of Alexander Selkirk, a family tree and life in the Largo Area in the 1600/1700s, along with talks and fundraising sales of postcards of local historical scenes and posters of Robinson Crusoe.

It is hoped that community groups in our area will get involved and come up with ideas. Several groups have already got involved, like a Robinson Crusoe themed Big Picnic, a friendly cricket match and Friends of Largo Bay are celebrating World Oceans Day in June. The talented Ukrainian children from Dundee will return to perform their Robinson Crusoe story.

Do you remember the 300th anniversary celebrations? Maybe you even have something lurking in the cupboard? If you would like to get involved please either contact LCT, dig out those photos /memorabilia or just keep an eye out for the programme of events that will be coming out soon.

It's been a busy time for FoLB since last issue.

In the run up to the festive season, FoLB ran a stall at the Aurrie Mor Christmas Fair where a lovely group of volunteers made and sold our ever-popular sustainable cleaning products and cards along with a few new ideas such as lavender bags. They raised an impressive £153.45 to help with our community projects.

The Largo Bay Community Triptych continues apace. We were lucky enough to have support from Ellie at East Coast Interiors who gave us invaluable help both by allowing us to use her large cutting table to accommodate the large panels and by checking measurements and assisting with the cutting. Ellie also gave us weight bars to put in the bottom of the panels for even hanging. Thanks Ellie.

The next stage is to begin construction of the background scenery. Largo Law and trees and bushes will be made using felting techniques and Stephie Hendrie has kindly offered to teach this technique to those who are interested. Do get in touch if you'd like to join us.

Moving forward, we are excited to announce that, from 6th – 7th June, we will be putting on the first Largo Bay Blue Spaces Festival: Spotlight on Forth Conservation. This coincides with World Environment Day, which falls on Friday 5th June, with a focus on 'Ending Plastic

Pollution' and World Oceans Day, which falls on Monday 8th June, and has 'Supporting Marine Biodiversity' as its focus.

We have invited a number of groups from around the Forth Basin that we collaborate with in our many projects. The festival will provide an open engaging space for local residents and visitors to connect with the organisations working to protect the Forth through activities such as interactive stalls, demonstrations, citizen-science activities, and creative workshops. Alongside this, we will have films, talks and discussion groups.

Courgette Spaghetti with Avocado Recipe



Preparing courgettes in this manner gives you scope for all sorts of accompanying ideas, so do try this one and then use your imagination, lots of fresh herbs and perhaps some grated Anster cheese . .

Ingredients

4 medium courgettes
15 Brazil nuts
3 avocados
4 tblsp rapeseed oil
Juice of a lime
½ tsp salt
20 button mushrooms

Method

1. You can cut the courgettes by hand, trim top and bottom then slice along the length carefully into four slices, then slice them into long strips. Some food processors have a blade for this but make sure the courgettes are firm other wise you may end up with a mush! I use a wonderful gadget called a Mandolin which does the job very quickly.
2. Put the nuts in a food processor and blend for about 5 minutes, until smooth, add the avocados, 2 tblsp oil and salt, add a little cold water until a creamy consistency is achieved.
3. Slice the mushrooms, heat the remaining oil in a large pan and gently sweat the mushrooms to soften, add the courgette spaghetti and stir to soften for a few minutes, pour on the sauce and mix to heat through. Don't allow to get too hot as the avocado will turn bitter.

“A Seminal Moment in the History of Largo”.



Tuesday 22 January at 11am — and it certainly made an entrance. Because of the narrow streets and two particularly tight turns, a tractor transported the structure along the beach, before a crane carefully lifted the two sections into place.

One local resident, who lives near the Orrie, summed up the moment perfectly:

“This is the biggest, most exciting thing to happen in Largo since the Texan rock cutter arrived in 1985.”

“Beach access for all” was one of the themes to emerge from community consultations for the Local Place Plan. That shared aspiration set in motion a project which has now reached a major milestone.

In September 2022, a steering group was formed to explore how Largo Beach could become more accessible for everyone. Plans were developed for a modular building to house a Changing Places Toilet, an additional accessible toilet, and storage for a beach wheelchair loan scheme, now known as Largo Beach Wheelchairs. The building was designed to sit in Temple car park, Lower Largo, behind the existing public toilets.

After three years and four months of planning, fundraising and sheer persistence, the building finally arrived on



While some work remains before the facility becomes fully operational, this is already a significant asset for the community. It marks a powerful step towards making Largo a welcoming destination that truly delivers Access for All.

East Fife Riding for the Disabled - Celebrating 50 years



The group was started in 1976 on John and Lily Mason's farm, Scooniehill, just outside St Andrews. Since then, we have

worked out of many yards, but you will now find us at Balcormo Stud Farm, with the Low Mitchells. We rent 8 acres of grassland and have developed part of the indoor area, putting up 7 stables, a corral area and a feed and tack room.

Yard manager and coach, Fran Cape has been involved with the group since she was a teenager. She is now fully employed as an RDA Advanced Coach. She runs the yard and oversees all of our operations. Our other employee is Karen Naismith who is also a qualified RDA coach, and we have one volunteer coach in Aileen Jones.

We currently have about 100 participants and offer many activities: Endeavour Awards, Countryside Challenge, Riding, Proficiency Tests, National Championships (virtual), Reflective, wellbeing session (e.g. Quiet Corners), Groundwork sessions (e.g. leading, long reining), Creative writing / Arts & Crafts, Horse care.

In addition, we have 45 volunteers who are an essential part of the team. They bring a wide skill set to our group and are involved with all aspects of our work.

We have a mixed bag of 6 wonderful gentle ponies and horses whom we train to do the work we ask.

The non-ridden side of our work is a key part of our programme. We designed and developed a Sensory Garden with raised box beds, a picnic area for the good weather and a cabin for poor weather. The horses are in the paddock beside the cabin so they can take part in chatting.

The other part of our non-ridden work involves the local high schools. Teachers were reporting issues with pupils suffering a lack of confidence and anxiety. We started teaching them to lead, groom and perform stable duties. The results were really positive, and we now work with Madras, Levenmouth Academy, Waid, Bell Baxter and Balwearie High School. We also work with children from the Support Unit in Fife.

We are 50 years old in 2026! A remarkable achievement. Among various events this year we will have a stand at the Big Picnic in June but before that we are holding a Quiz Night at the Montrave Hall on Saturday 21st March. Please look out for details for that event as well as others throughout the year on our Facebook and Instagram pages 'EastFifeRDA' or contact me Ian on marketing@eastfiferda.org.uk should you have any questions or thoughts on how you might be able to help, be it volunteering or financially, during this very special year of ours.



In this issue we have a special report for the Crusoe Kids from three super talented locals who spent time with P4s to P6s in Lundin Mill Primary School to teach them all about film making. Here is their story.

Hello from Tristan Bleak, Louie Williamson, and Ethan Robertson. In summer 2025 we worked with the P4 to P6 pupils of Lundin Mill on a film project.



We were contacted by Priya Logan of LCT to work with the Largo Youth community to discover what they think about Largo through film.

We finally settled on two parts to our project. The first was to support two classes of Lundin Mill in making their own short films with as much creative freedom as possible. We wanted to facilitate their

creativity and introduce concepts of film to them, which are often excluded from school curriculums.

The second part of the project was to make a documentary exploring how the pupils approached filmmaking, how they applied their views of home to their projects, and the opinions of different generations within the Largo community about the youth and their future.

We filmed for a week The first day was spent in pre-production coming up with ideas for their films and letting them get to know us and become comfortable working with us. The second and third days were spent filming their projects, whilst the Thursday and Friday were spent editing and showing them their films.

Though it was an intense week this was the most engaged we had ever been in a project. The primary school pupils were amazingly creative and determined to have fun in everything they did. The energy and commitment they brought to their films was both wonderful to see and entirely revitalising to us as young filmmakers trying to make our way in the industry.

By the end of the week we were very proud and happy with the results. Following this we realised that we had enough footage and variation in the different days to create our first feature film, something that we do not think anyone else in our year at university have been able to do.



On top of this, the Q and A we did later in the month turned out to be the perfect conclusion we needed for the film.

Following this week in production and the long intense editing period we realised that this was not only something which we wanted to do again but to expand and develop. Thus, we are now in the process of developing a two-week summer school for film in Fife.

The principal behind the summer school is that each week we will work with a different age group, the first being a younger group of primary school students, and the second being a teenage group that we did not get to work with last summer. In each week the students will be taught more specifics of film in the

first few days including workshops with sound equipment, camera equipment, and even special lessons like production design including set dressing and costume. Following this each group of students will get one of the teachers as their tutor who will help them to make their film, they will then get to make their film and edit themselves with industry standard editing software.

The basic premise of our summer school is to continue to give students the opportunity to create their own films with as much creative freedom as we can give them, whilst also allowing them to work with industry equipment they may not be able to work with in typical environments whilst being taught by current university students who wish to pass on what they have learned. We would first like to offer the summer school to students at Lundin Mill and Waid Academy, and if the school is successful, we would love to expand to other schools such as more Primaries in the east Neuk and Levenmouth Academy.

We believe not only that young people across Scotland should be able to have opportunities to work in film, but also that they should have the creative freedom to make films about whatever they want to, and we would like to continue to uphold these values with an annual film summer school for the Youth of Largo and the surrounding area.

(By our wonderful volunteers at Lundin Links Library)


Memento Mori by Muriel Spark.



It's for moments like these that we establish twinning arrangements," said Michel Tardivat, president of the Villennes-Largo twinning committee. "I think they will remember the meeting with the MP. Her approachability, in such an impressive setting, made a lasting impression on all of us."

They are keen for some of our teenagers to organise a visit to Villennes-Sur -Seine; possibly in July this year.
