The Appreciation of Nature in Largo

Largo not only boasts a stunning and varied natural environment but has also been home to a few eminent naturalists over the years. The ancient tree specimens found at both Lundin House and Largo House inspired long term tenant John Jeffrey to compile the richly illustrated "Trees and Shrubs of Fife and Kinross" in 1879 with Charles Howie, a botanist who specialised in trees, mosses and ferns. Howie, who resided at Eden Cottage in Upper Largo, was the driving force behind the Largo Field Naturalists' Society, which was instituted in 1863 to advance the study of natural history locally. As well as curating a small museum and running field trips and talks, the Society organised an annual grand horticultural fete. Held at various locations including Keil's Den and the grounds of Largo House, this long-running popular event encouraged local people to showcase their considerable skills at growing flowers, fruit and vegetables, alongside home-produced honey, eggs and so on.

The granddaughter of John Jeffrey was Leonora Rintoul, who together with close friend Evelyn Baxter, was a pioneer in the ornithological world. The Upper Largo-based duo published several papers before completing their seminal two-volume 'The Birds of Scotland, Their History, Distribution and Migration' (1953). Rintoul also compiled the 'Largo Village Book', which chronicled many aspects of everyday local life.

Unsurprisingly, the local flora and fauna were described in some detail in this 1932 book.

It wasn't only scholarly types who noted the goings on with the local plant and animal life. The local press provided regular updates on important issues such as unusually early nest-building activity, bumper yields of honey produced by the many local beekeepers, unseasonable sightings of butterflies and spectacular displays of wildflowers. Observation of nature continued into more recent decades with the revival in 1967 of 'Largo Field Studies Society'. The aim of this group was to stimulate interest in local surroundings, through the pursuit of archaeology, local history, geology, botany, ornithology and more. The Society produced the book 'Largo 21' in 1988 to mark 21 years of activity and they continued for some years thereafter.

Today the community continues to benefit from both individuals and groups who observe and care for the natural environment. From the biodiversity monitoring carried out by Friends of Largo Bay, to the annual flower show organised by Largo and Newburn Horticultural Society, to those individuals who take the time to appreciate the changing seasons at local beauty spots like Keil's Den, it's encouraging to see that Largo people continue to value and celebrate our natural surroundings.

Get ready for a vibrant celebration of art, community, and fun as Largo Arts Week returns for its 7th year from Saturday, July 18th to Sunday, July 26th, 2026. This year's festival shines a spotlight on the incredible talent of local youth alongside a fantastic lineup of established artists and performers.

Following the success of last year's 'Lundie Seals' auction which raised over £5,000, Largo Arts Week is thrilled to present its new charity event: the 'Selkirk Seagulls' auction, raising vital funds for Maggie's, Fife. Local artists have been busy decorating seagulls, and the stunning results will be unveiled during the festival.

Prepare for a Sculpture Trail, a collaboration between Largo Arts Week and Lundin Mill Primary & Nursery. See the amazing creations of local children as they bring their visions to life in large-scale sculptures across the villages. This forms part of the Alexander Selkirk's 350th Year Celebrations.

Festival-goers can explore over 34 artist studios showcasing the work of 59 talented artists. Our vibrant Artist Studios are the true backbone of the festival, featuring local artists opening their doors

in approximately 30 diverse locations across our charming villages.



Enjoy live music every evening from a variety of bands and performers, plus captivating storytelling sessions. This year's musical lineup includes welcome returns from Lights Out By Nine, Kwak, Herding Cats and The Best Dressed Blues Band, along with local heroes Astral Suns.

A special gig & workshops will feature the renowned Scottish-based jazz duo Sophie Bancroft & Tom Lyne. Heralded as a 'must see' act at a recent Xerox Rochester International Jazz Festival in New York, their repertoire includes a mix of original contemporary jazz-based songs alongside reimagined jazz classics and covers by artists like Suzanne Vega and Joni Mitchell.

Largo Arts Week is truly Of the Community, For the Community, By the Community. Join us for nine days of artistic discovery, entertainment, and community spirit.



Growing Together: A Note from Largo Communities Together

What does four years of community effort look like? It looks like a beach clean on a grey morning with a hundred volunteers. It looks like residents sharing stories over soup at the Simpson Institute. It looks like young people from Lundin Mill School making films about the place they call home.

Largo Communities Together has been quietly weaving these threads together since our formation in 2018, and we want to take a moment in this issue of Largo Links to reflect on what the community has built, and to look ahead with real excitement at what is coming next.

We continue to explore ways to support emerging groups, projects and plans across the area, connecting with individuals and organisations locally, and reaching out to national and regional bodies for support and guidance when it is needed. That spirit of connection is at the heart of what we do.

This spring marks the end of a significant round of funding which has enabled us to support a huge variety of activities over recent years. The very first Local Place Plan engagements asked residents what they wanted for this area. Many goals and aspirations from that process continue to make themselves seen and gave us a Community Action Plan.

Some of that work you may already know well.

Friends of Largo Bay have grown into a remarkable force. They are running a Blue Space Festival in early June and beginning to influence policy around our coastline. They have also been developing their own income-generating activity through eco-products, workshops and talks, building toward a more self-sustaining future.

The Heritage Group have an impressive exhibition already under their belt and are looking forward to a flurry of activities later in the year exploring the life of Alexander Selkirk, that most famous of local figures, as well as oral history recording and supporting the development of trails and with aspirations of an archive.

Our Warm Welcome Days have now run for four winter seasons at the Simpson Institute in Upper Largo, offering a warm space and good company to residents and visitors.

Our Greenways group has been progressing work on pathways and access across the area and campaigning to add more important routes to the Corepaths provision to improve and protect safe ways to get around.

A note from LCT continued...

Our Resilience Group has been quietly building emergency planning capacity.

And our **Sustainable Development subgroup** has been laying the groundwork for a long-term Largo Area Framework.

That funding period is closing, but the work it made possible very much continues.

Young people have been central to our work in ways that have surprised and delighted us. The Largo Area Youth Film Project brought together pupils from Lundin Mill School and beyond to make Largo's Eye, a film that was first screened at our AGM in November 2025. The project has opened up a continuing youth engagement strand that is now moving toward more creative activities.

None of this happens alone. We are so grateful for the partnerships that make this work possible. Homelands has been a valued partner in our dementia-friendly community work alongside Alzheimer's Scotland and Peacehaven. Together we have completed a full dementia-friendly assessment and action plan, delivered Dementia Friends training, and are working on ongoing support for residents living with dementia and their families.

We work closely with the Largo Area Community Council, the Largo Library and Community Hub, and the many halls and venues in the area.

We have relationships with the University of St Andrews (getting help from some amazing interns), Community Land Scotland, the Marine Conservation Society, Fife Communities Climate Action Network, Youth First, Fife Raynet and many others. These partnerships are an asset in their own right, and we do not take them for granted.

Running an active community development trust is a balancing act, and we want to acknowledge the contribution of our volunteers, and the businesses and organisations who add value in so many ways. In particular, thanks to our trustees who hold this together with dedication and care.

What the last few years have shown us is that the foundations are solid. The subgroups are active, the partnerships are working, the community is engaged, and we have a clear plan to build for the long term.

There is much more to come. You will be able to meet all our groups at the Big Picnic and Parade on 21 June at Lundin Links Common, and we hope very much that you will join us. Watch this space and reach out if you have anything to add.

Why Blue Spaces Matter

Blue spaces - our seas, rivers, lochs, and shorelines - are places where water and people meet, some of us for work, some for recreation. Whether natural or man-made, these environments offer more than just scenic views; they provide space to breathe, reflect, and reconnect. Times spent by water has been shown to reduce stress and boost wellbeing. Like green spaces, blue spaces play a vital role in supporting healthier, happier communities - making their protection more important than ever.

Our Blue Space, Our Festival

This connection was the driving force behind Largo Blue Space Festival. This year, World Environment Day and World Oceans Day aligned around urgent global themes: ending plastic pollution and supporting marine biodiversity.

Through interactive stalls, hands-on demonstrations, citizen science activities, creative workshops, and film screenings, the festival invited people of all ages to learn, engage, and have a go. At its core, the festival's aim was to spark curiosity across generations, build connections and encourage participation in the long-term care for our coastal environment.

Inspired by this moment, FoLB sought to bring together like-minded people for a weekend festival which celebrated our shared coastline and highlighted the tireless work taking place to protect it.

Coastal Testimonies Exhibition: Stories from the Shore

A powerful highlight of the festival is the Coastal Testimonies exhibition, created by the Our Seas Coalition. Held during the festival weekend, and until 30th June, at The Aurrie, the exhibition offers a deeper, engaging perspective on Scotland's seas. Bringing together voices from across the country, the exhibition shares personal stories and striking photographic portraits that reflect the richness, diversity and importance of coastal life.

Since 2023, the Our Seas Coalition has travelled the length of Scotland's coastline, gathering first-hand testimonies from people connected to the sea. Each individual's story offers a unique insight into the challenges and hopes for Scotland's waters.

These stories are brought to life through the lens of photographer Katerina Barvirova, whose portraits capture the deep, often poignant, connections between people and place.

Do try to catch the Blue Space Festival if you can and, if not, do pop in to The Aurrie and browse the exhibition – remember, it's running until the 30th June.

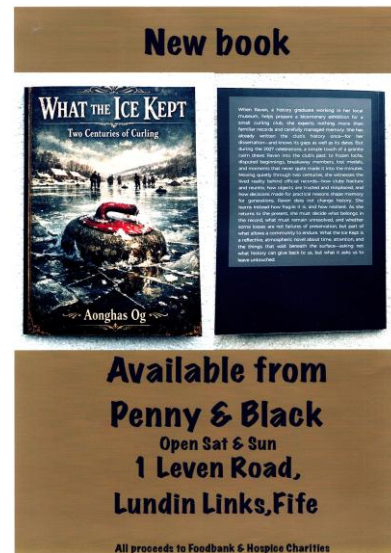

William Dampier (1651-1715)

Dampier was in overall control of an expedition which set sail in 1708. He sailed with two ships, the *St George* and the *Cinque Ports*. The ships were separated as they rounded the Horn. He was not involved in the stranding of Alexander Selkirk, but he was on board the *Duke* which rescued him.

Ironically, 25 years before that, he was the Captain of another voyage, on the *Batchelor's Delight*, which rescued "Meskito Will" from a three-year solitude on the same island, Más á Tierra. Will, from the Mosquito Coast of Nicaragua, had voluntarily joined an earlier pirate boat. He was left alone on the island, when his shipmates had sighted some Spanish ships.

Dampier's account of Will in his book "A New Voyage round the World" is thought by some to be the inspiration of Man Friday in the fictional Robinson Crusoe.

Dampier is the first man to have recorded three circumnavigations of the world.

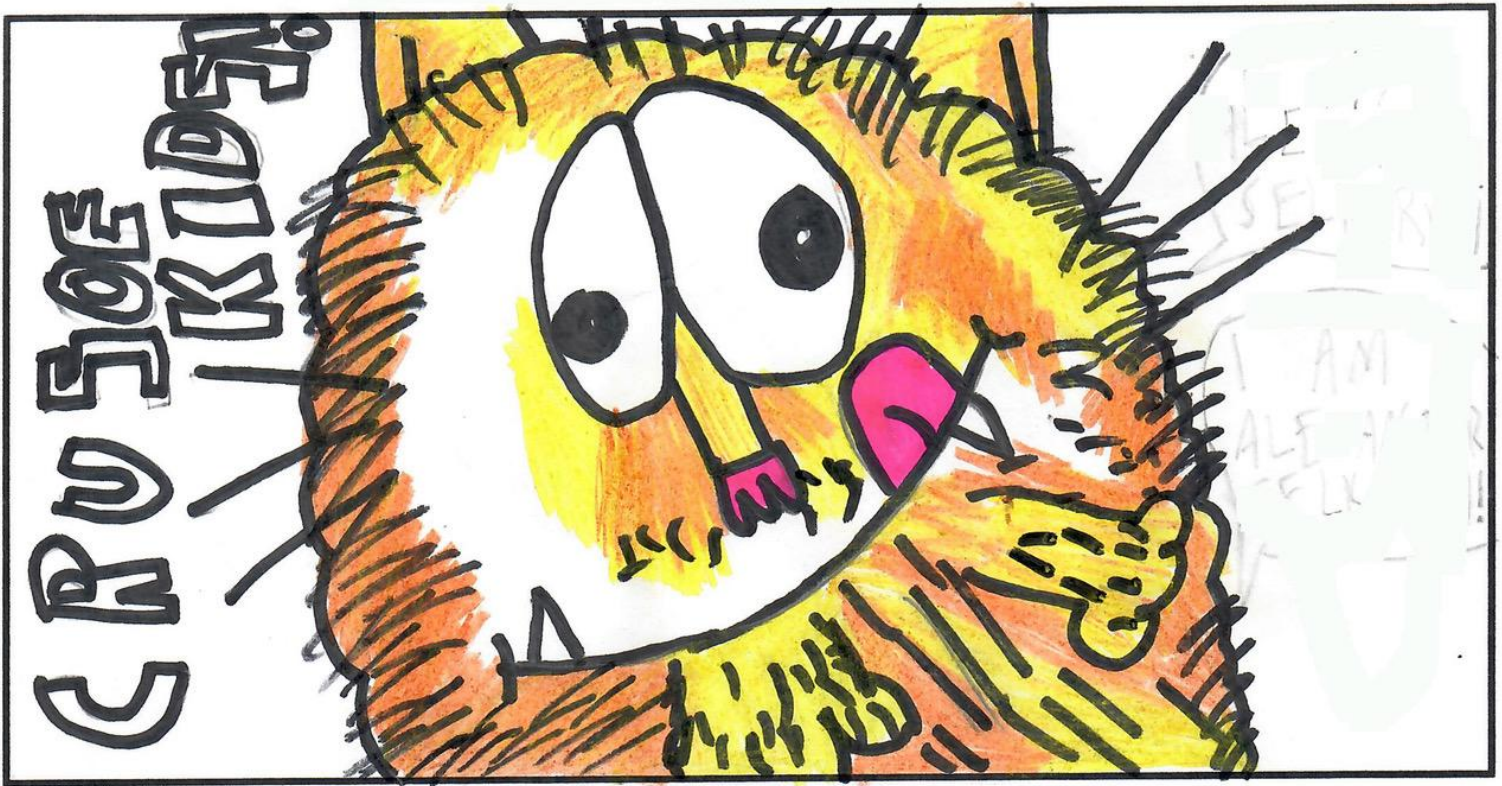

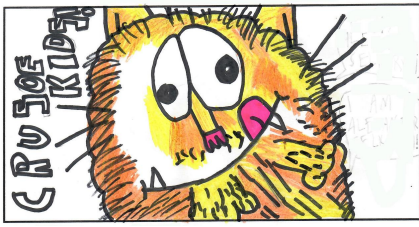

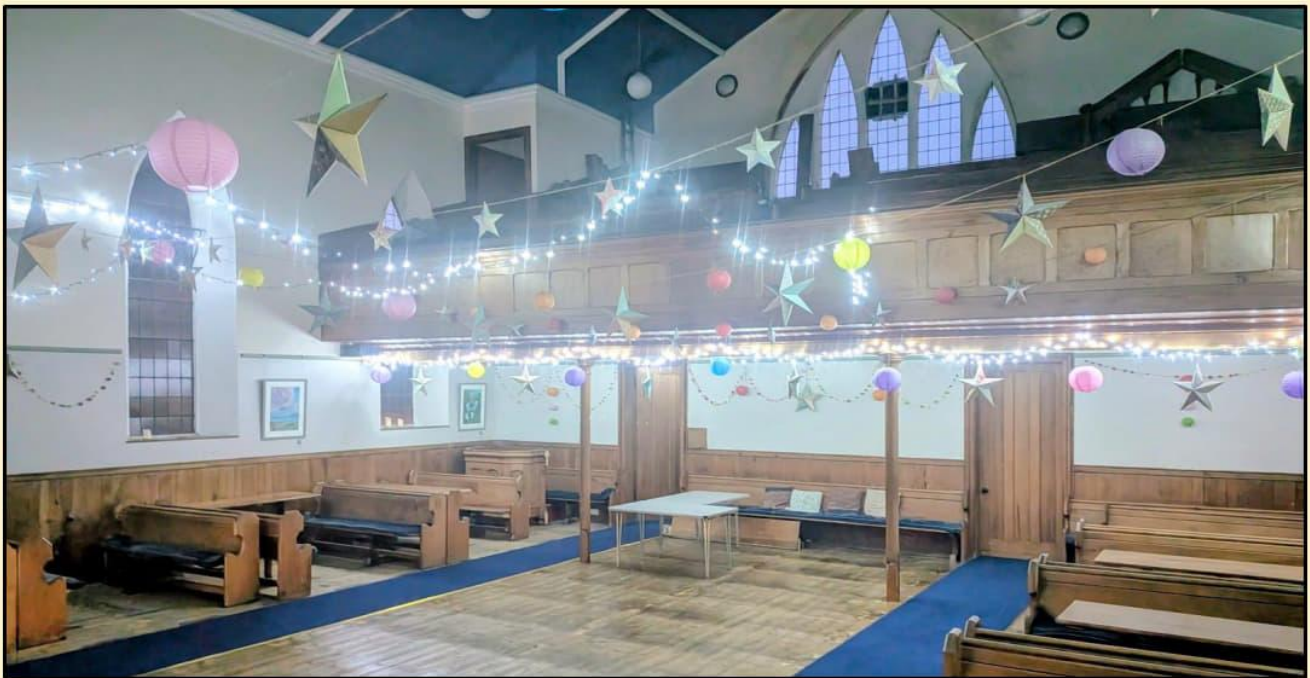

Chickpeas With Carrots and Chard



A simple accompaniment for fish or lamb but a good dish on its own. You can use canned chickpeas to save time but cooking them yourself with garlic adds great flavour!

Ingredients

100g dried chickpeas soaked in water overnight
1 head of garlic
2 tblsp olive oil, plus more to dress
1 medium onion, finely chopped
Clove garlic, crushed, with a little sea salt
300g carrots, diced
Tin chopped tomatoes
1 tsp tomato puree
200g chard, stalks removed and finely shredded
1 tblsp chopped mint
Hebridean sea salt and ground black pepper

Method

1. Drain the chickpeas and put into a pan with the garlic head sliced in half through the middle; cover with water, bring to the boil and simmer gently for an hour or so until tender.
2. Drain, remove the garlic, season with salt and pepper and a little olive oil.
3. Heat 2 tblsp olive oil in a pan and gently sweat the chopped onion to soften, add the crushed garlic, chard stalks and carrots and continue to cook for 10 minutes.
4. Stir in the tinned tomatoes and the puree and cook to thicken slightly.
5. Tear up the chard leaves into manageable pieces and stir into the mixture with the mint; check for seasoning and add some more olive oil.

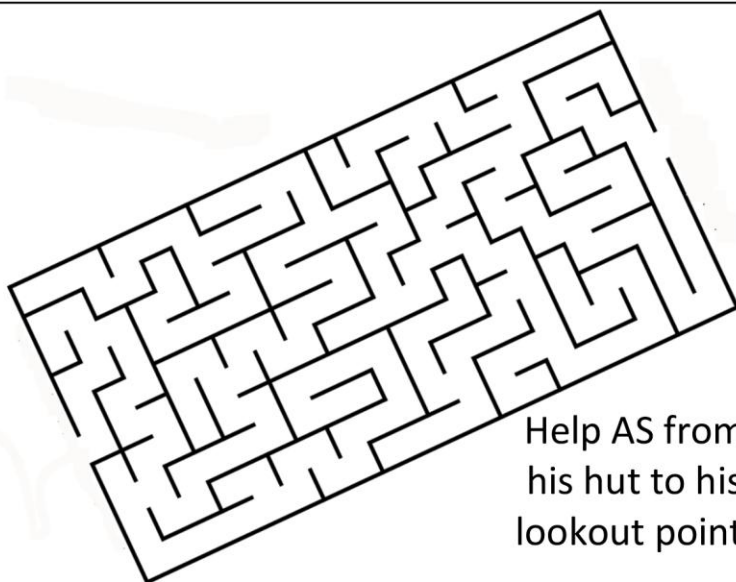

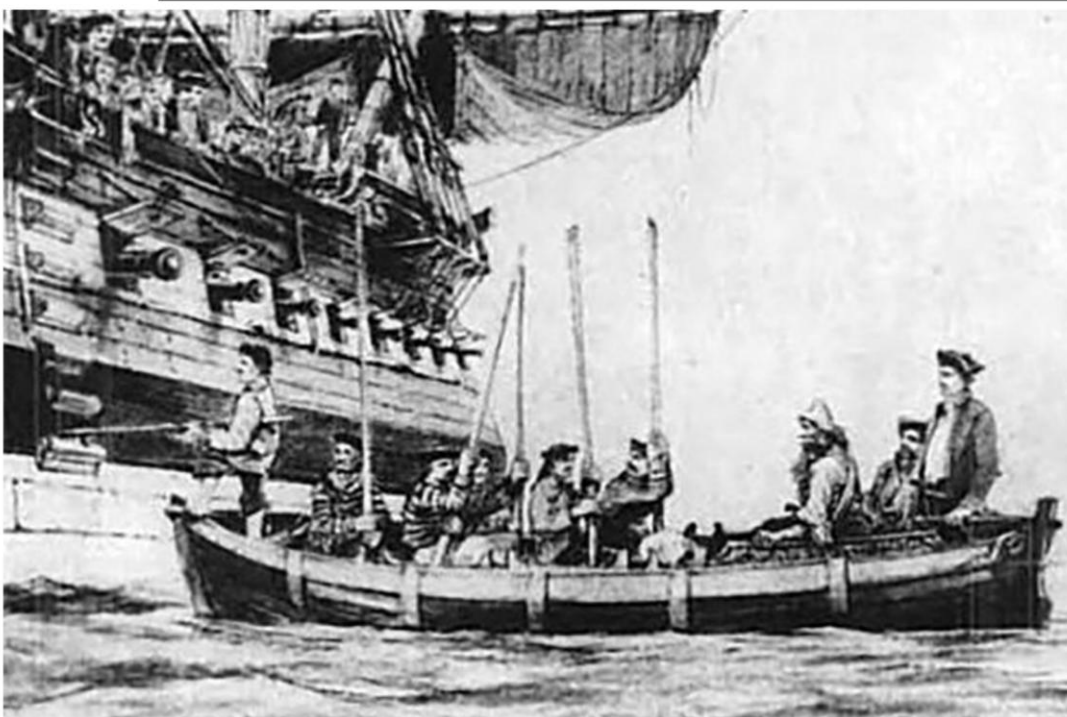

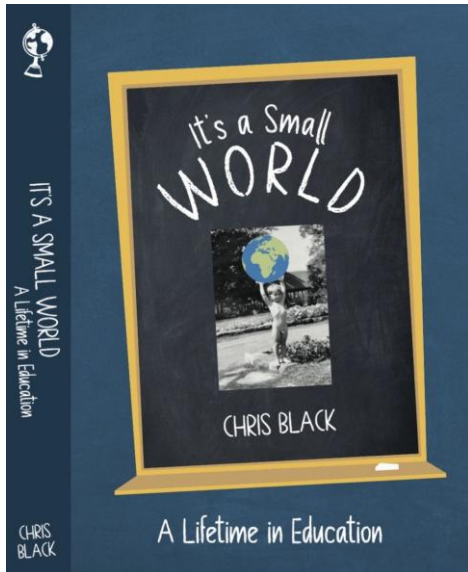

Book Review: It's a Small World – A Lifetime in Education



This recently published book by Largo resident, Chris Black, begins with an intriguing account of one of his ancestors leaving the

Fife village of Leslie to seek their fortune in South Africa. Another ancestor was washed ashore in Durban Bay in 1850 and later founded the Durban Bank. Yet another fought in the Boer War, ending up an MP in Natal. Chris's grandfather worked in medicine for the nephew of W.G Grace, the famous cricketer and retired as Professor of Obstetrics and Gynaecology in Johannesburg. And that's all within the first 50 pages of this fascinating book.

Young Chris was a pupil at Cowan House in Natal - a school founded by his parents where he would later be a teacher and eventually headmaster. Over the years his career has taken him from South Africa to Berkshire to work in a prep school feeder for Eton, later on to Malvern, then Tenerife and finally Edinburgh.

The book is steeped in serendipity and chance encounters. There are brushes with royalty and celebrity. In a teaching career spanning six decades, Chris Black's

pupils have included princes, dukes and even a future prime minister. He once directed and composed the music for a school production that featured a young David Cameron and Prince Edward. Naturally their respective parents were in the audience. The charm of this book is the surprising connections with others that form a thread throughout the narrative. Reminders that despite its size, It's a Small World.

I heartily recommend this book, which can be found on the shelves of our community's own Largo Library.

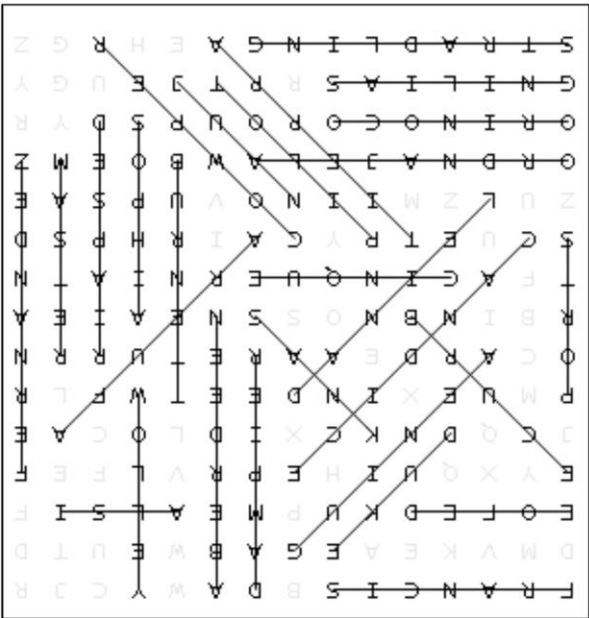

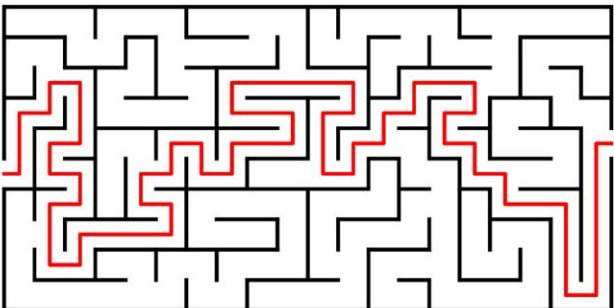


